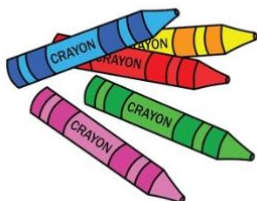
Solve the word problems below that involve simple addition. Use the space provided for drawing or showing your solution. Encircle your final answer.
